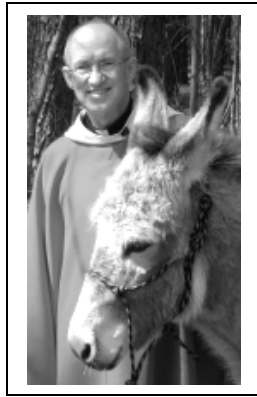


Pastor's Corner

My dear Friends,

First, St. Mary's was pleased to welcome Padre Carlos Rubio to St. Mary's on July 1st. He is the former Pastor of our sister parish, San Francisco de Asís, in Reitoca, FM, Honduras. Fourth, beginning the last Sunday of August, the diocese will host a "forma extraordinaria" Mass at 7 p.m. at St. Mary's upon my invitation. It will occur the last Sunday of each month at 7 p.m. This Mass was common in modern times of our Church history but declined greatly when the Second Vatican Council asked us to go back to the ancient Mass, i.e., the Mass conducted in the language of the people. The forma extraordinaria Mass is a diocesan event, not a ministry of St. Mary parish. Our parish will continue to only offer the ancient form of the Mass in English and Spanish. 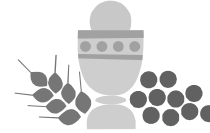

The Family**

Honduras is a very family-oriented society. In this photo, we see a typical family from Reitoca, FM, on their way to the clinic in town. Because Honduras is so family-oriented, when people show up for appointments at clinics or to receive other services, they often bring the whole family along. This has important consequences for architects and builders who must provide enough space and furniture for families, not just individuals. Especially important is to have enough room for kids to play. In our own parish, we see the same phenomenon in our Hispanic community when whole families show up for an appointment. Oftentimes three generations of family members live under one roof.

New PreK-3 Program at St. Mary School
